

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Outcomes of the project - Interviews

- Project partners are widely "recognised as experts in the field".
- Acknowledgement of exceptional training.
- Project partners have "have played a significant role in publishing the first-ever guidelines for sectors".
- The establishment of MDTs as a "pivotal outcome of this collaboration".







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Conclusions

- The inclusive cities model has proven a huge success, positively impacting policy and practice in the Western Balkan Region.
- This has had also impacted also on the international context, not the least through the integration of Recovery in WFAD structures but also the promotion of recovery on international levels, such as the CND.
- Strengthened capacity to work with inclusive cities, local and national stakeholders.
- Showcasing positive and hopeful success stories has been instrumental and effectively creating visibility and reducing stigma.
